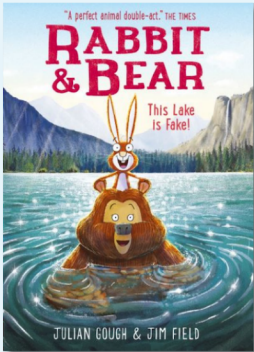


Rabbit & Bear: This Lake is Fake!

TIME TO TALK

- 1 Why do you think Rabbit hated winter? What season do you not like and why?

- 4 Why wouldn't Rabbit cry in front of his friends? Describe a time, when you have tried not to cry in front of other people.
- 5 How does Bear treat Rabbit? What does this tell us about their relationship?
- 5 Why did the cormorant laugh at Rabbit? Should you laugh at people if they make silly mistakes, explain your thoughts.
- 6 When Rabbit closes his eyes, he has no friends in his 'perfect world'. Why is that? Do you think it would be good to have no friends in a 'perfect world'?
- 7 What terrible lesson did Rabbit learn about himself? Have you learnt something about yourself in a difficult way?
- 8 Rabbit didn't like the poo and wouldn't clean it away. What did the animals use the poo for? Discuss how Rabbit changed towards the end of the story.
